## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

- The police department received 1681 calls for service from 12/01/22-12/31/22. 31 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Driving with a Suspended License, Assault & Battery on Police Officer, Possession Class A and B Drugs, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Fail to Register as a Sex Offender and Violate of Abuse Prevention Order. There were thirty eight (38) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 5 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 6 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation.
- Chief Labrie spoke to the Law Academy at Northbridge High School. This program is run under the direction of NHS Teacher Alan Finkel. Chief Labrie provided a background of what it takes to become a police officer, Criminal Law, and Substance Abuse.
- Officer Tom DeJordy provided “Active Shooter/Violent Intruder training for the staff at the Milford Regional Medical Center, 100 Commerce Drive.
- Chief Labrie met with Advinia Care administrators to discuss building security, active shooter/violent intruder training and procedures. Officer DeJordy will set up staff training soon.
- Chief Labrie and Officer Levon Derkosrofian met with IT Director Scott Motyka to discuss the future installation of fiber optic lines in town and the town buildings.
- Officers worked traffic patrol shifts as part of the Municipal Road Safety Grant. These patrols concentrated on Impaired Driving.
- SRO Tom DeJordy attended a two-day annual SRO re-certification training at the Municipal Police Training Center in Southbridge.
- SRO DeJordy visited the Whitinsville Library to speak with the youths about behavior while inside the library.

- Chief Labrie attended a meeting of various town officials to discuss the permitting process for a new marijuana dispensary that is proposed for Main Street in the area of Walmart.
- Jared Smith and Bradley Cundiff were hired as dispatchers and started training under the direction of Admin Asst. Lisa Gaylord and Dispatcher Jeffrey Mayer. Both new dispatchers will train on the various shifts until they can work alone.
- Student Officer Brian Carroll started the Municipal Police Academy in Randolph on 12/5/22.
- Chief Labrie attended a town wide staff meeting hosted by the Town Manager.
- Chief Labrie hosted the Safety Committee meeting at the Northbridge Police Department on 12/21/22.
- Chief Labrie was selected as a panel member to represent the community for Open Sky’s pilot program-” Furniture A.R.T. Program. A.R.T.-Adaptive Recovery Teaching. This program is offered through Open Sky and supports self-restoration through the power of community.
- Dispatcher Jeffrey Mayer completed his renewal EMD (Emergency Medical Dispatching) Certification.
