ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The police department received 1602 calls for service from 01/01/23 01/31/23. 34 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Driving with a Suspended License, Assault & Battery on Family Household Member, Assault and Battery on Ambulance Personnel, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Shoplifting and Violation of Abuse Prevention Order. There were thirty two (32) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 5 of the accidents resulted in personal injury including one pedestrian. 8 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation.
- Several Officers assisted with traffic control for the annual "First Day Road Race" held on Sunday January 1, 2023.
- Chief Labrie and Sgt. Patrinelli took part in an interview panel for the screening of a Clinician that will be assigned to the Northbridge and Douglas Police Department as part of the "Co-Response Jail Diversion Program."
- Sgt. Patrinelli took the candidate from the above interview on a ride along throughout the town as part of the screening process.
- Officer Dejordy conducted "Active Shooter" training at the Milford Regional Medical Center on Commerce Drive in town. Officer Dejordy conducted training for over 125 employees at this site.
- Chief Labrie started working on the FY-24 operating budget of the Police Department.
- Chief Labrie and Lt. Ouillette conducted equipment/uniform/cruiser inspections for all the officers of the Department.
- Officers Kaitlyn Laflash and Benjamin O'Donnell attended annual "In-Service" training in Southbridge. This is sponsored by the Municipal Police Training Committee (MPTC).

- Sgt. Ryan Levesque, Sgt. Brian Collins, and Officer Matthew Leonard attended Intoxilyzer training at the Bourse Police Department. This training certifies them as Intoxilyzer Operators. This training was sponsored by the Office of Alcohol Testing.
- CEMLEC Swat members, Sgt. Levesque and Officer Tyler Mitchell assisted the Swat Team and the Marlboro Police Department with taking custody of an armed suspect (knife). All officers and suspect were uninjured during the incident.
- Officer Levon DerKosrofian continued negotiations with Spectrum for the implementation of Fiberoptics inside the department versus the current coax lines. Fiberoptics is the future of technology and will improve the overall speed and function of the current operating system.
- Chief Labrie hosted a Safety Committee meeting at the Northbridge Police Department. Topics: Providence Rd. & Sutton St. Intersection, Mumford River Walk, Stop Sign at Cottage and Hill St.
- Officer Kaitlyn Laflash, members of the CEMLEC (Central Massachusetts Law Enforcement Council) Accident Reconstruction Team along with members of the Northbridge Police Department investigated a serious motor vehicle vs. Pedestrian crash on Quaker St.
- Admin. Asst. To the Chief of Police, Lisa Gaylord and Dispatcher Jared Smith completed their annual EMD (Emergency Medical Dispatch) training.
- Chief Labrie, Sergeant, Patrinelli, Det. Sgt. Gorman, and Officers Leonard and SRO DeJordy assisted the Northbridge Elementary School with a practice lockdown drill.
- SRO DeJordy participated in a Zoom meeting with the Opioid Task Force headed up by District Attorney Joe Early.
- Det. Sgt. Gorman led a 2-month investigation into a "Bomb Threat" received by Advinia Care in Northbridge and their various other locations throughout the state. Det. Sgt. Gorman was the affiant of several search warrants that resulted in the identification of a Salem, MA female in her mid 20's. Det. Sgt. Gorman was assisted in this investigation by Det. White and Lt. Ouillette. Due to the number of bomb threats sent out to multiple

Advinia Care facilities throughout the state, the matter was handed over to the FBI. The FBI charged the female in US District Court. This is great police work done at the local level and with cooperation from the FBI, the woman was criminally charged.
