ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The police department received 1693 calls for service from 03/01/23 – 03/31/23. 41 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Driving with a Suspended License, Assault & Battery on Family Household Member, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Unarmed Robbery, Bomb/Hijack Threat Causing Serious Alarm of School, Indecent A&B on Person 14 or Over and Tagging Property. There were thirty (30) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 4 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 9 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation.
- Chief Labrie hosted the monthly meeting of the Northbridge Safety Committee.
- Chief Labrie met with Michael Wilkes of the Northbridge Redevelopment Authority.
- The Northbridge Police Association met with Gronk Fitness Equipment to discuss adding a fitness center inside the police department building.
- Officers Tyler Mitchell and Kaitlyn Laflash participated in the annual Blackstone Valley Home Expo at the Northbridge High School field house.
- Several members of the Northbridge Police Department attended the Board of Selectmen meeting on 3/27/23 to honor Trooper Jillian Shenian of the Massachusetts State Police. Trooper Shenian is the first Northbridge born female Trooper. Jillian and the entire Shenian family are lifelong residents of the Town of Northbridge. The support from NPD and the MSP (MA State Police) is a credit to the Shenian family.
- Chief Labrie attended a meeting of the Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association. A major topic was the current certification of officers through POST (Peace Officer Standards and Training) Commission, (Massachusetts Peace Officers Standards and Training Commission)
- Sgt. Patrinelli completed Defensive Tactics training for members of the Uxbridge Police Department. Sgt. Patrinelli is the only certified Defensive tactics instructor in the surrounding towns and started training for the Blackstone and Douglas Police Departments along with members of the Northbridge Police Department. This is mandatory training that is provided annually.
- Chief Labrie attended a meeting of the By-Law Review Committee.
- Several members of the department investigated a threat made to a Northbridge High School student. Officers investigated the incident after receiving a call from the FBI (Federal Bureau of Investigation). The Northbridge Police Department worked with the FBI, Marlboro Police Department, and the Northbridge School Department to identify the suspect. The suspect was intercepted at the school, interviewed, sent for a mental health evaluation, and charged with “Making Terroristic Threats.”
