ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The police department received 1649 calls for service from 04/01/23 04/30/23. 35 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Improper Storage of Firearm, Assault & Battery on Family Household Member, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Unarmed Robbery, Set Fire to Another's Land, Rape and Destruction of Property. There were twenty three (23) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 2 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 5 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation.
- Chief Labrie, Sgt. Ryan Levesque and Officer Matthew Leonard attended the annual In-Service Training sponsored by the Municipal Police Training Committee.
- Chief Labrie and Officer Benjamin O'Donnell attended the Board of Selectman meeting to testify at a dog hearing.
- School Resource Officer Tom Dejordy participated in the NHS Law Academy and conducted a field trip to the Uxbridge District Court.
- SRO Dejordy attended the Northbridge Public Schools Celebration of Learning & Arts at Northbridge High School.
- Sgt. Brian Patrinelli and Officer Ryan Falvey attended a weeklong Defensive Tactics training seminar sponsored by Gracie University Gracie Survival Tactics Instructor Certification Program. These officers will be certified to teach officers defensive tactics when dealing with Mixed Martial Arts.
- Several members of the department investigated an Unarmed Robbery at Santander Bank. The investigation resulted in the swift arrest of a 46 year-old Northbridge man.
- Lt. John Ouillette, Det. Sgt. Richard Gorman and Det. Jeffrey White participated in a multijurisdictional narcotics investigation that resulted in the seizure of over \$300,000 cash and several million dollars in narcotics and several high —end sports cars.

Patrinelli is the only certified Defensive tactics instructed in the surrounding towns and started training for the Blackstone, Uxbridge and Douglas Police Departments along with members of the Northbridge Police Department. This is mandatory training that is provided annually.
