# **PATROL:**

12,001 miles using approximately and 872 gallons of gasoline.

#### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The police department received 1900 calls for service from 05/01/23 – 05/31/23. 54 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Possess Large Capacity Firearm, Assault & Battery on Family Household Member, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Open and Gross Lewdness, Possess to Distribute Class A and Class B, B&E Building, Aggravated Rape of Child and Cruelty to Animals. There were thirty eight (38) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 6 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 8 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation.

- All officers received Defensive Tactics training to include annual Taser training and Mixed Martial Arts training. Instructors: Sgt. Brian Patrinelli, Det. Sgt. Richard Gorman, and Officer Ryan Falvey
- Chief Labrie hosted the monthly meeting of the Safety Committee.
- Sgt. Levesque and Officer Mitchell took part in CEMLEC Swat Training hosted at the old Northbridge Elementary School.
- Student Officer Brian Carroll graduated from the Municipal Police Training Committee Randolph Academy. Officer Carroll will complete 12 weeks of Field Training under the direction of Officers Jordan Tredeau and Tyler Mitchell.
- Chief Labrie and SRO DeJordy met with District Attorney Joe Early for a grant Operation Graduation 2023 received from Mr. Early.
- Officer Sean McDevitt met with sales representatives at Sheldon Harley Davidson to initiate the purchase of two police motorcycles. Officer McDevitt has been the lead officer behind this program and has done an outstanding job as the department forms the motorcycle unit. I would like to thank the Town Manager, Board of Selectman, Finance Committee, and citizens of the town for supporting this unit.
- Chief Labrie and members of the Safety Committee met with the State Department of Labor to discuss the flow of traffic at the Northbridge Elementary School and Northbridge Middle School.
- All officers received Firearms training. Instructors: Sgt. Ryan Levesque and Officer DeJordy
- Officer Levon DerKosrofian met with Spectrum to finalize the installation of "Fiber" at the department which will replace the old and antiquated "Coax" cable.
- Lt. John Ouillette, Det. Sgt. Gorman, Det. Jeffrey White, members of the Northbridge Police Department and Blackstone Valley Drug Task force executed a search warrant on Overlook St. The targets were repeat offenders for the illicit distribution of heroin, crack cocaine and fentanyl.
- Officers Sean McDevitt and Kaitlyn Laflash each arrested a subject for the possession of a firearm (handgun) without a license. These arrests were unrelated and within a two-week period. These arrests were the result of proactive police work and a reminder of the dangerous nature of this profession. One of the subjects was out on bail for a previous arrest for the same charge.

- Chief Labrie and SRO DeJordy attended a presentation by the Northbridge High School video production class., the MA Dept. Or Transportation, and MAPFRE Insurance. The class created a public service announcement about seatbelts that was selected first out of 28 entries. The class was presented awards from the MA DOT and CEO of MAPFRE Insurance. Congratulations to the students and their teacher, Mr. Newton, for this recognition.
- The Northbridge Police Department assisted with the annual Memorial Day Parade.
- SRO DeJordy participated in Community Career Day at Northbridge Middle School.
- State Representative David Muradian informed the department that we would be receiving a grant in the amount of \$12,500.00. These funds will be used to purchase "Active Shooter" training weapons and ammunition.
