## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The police department received 1822 calls for service from 06/01/23 – 06/30/23. 36 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Possess Large Capacity Firearm, Assault & Battery on Family Household Member, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Possess to Distribute Class A and Class B, Leave Scene of Property Damage Accident and Cruelty to Animals. There were twenty two (22) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 4 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 8 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 51 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Sgt. Patrinely met with the Blackstone Valley Association of Churches to discuss the homeless population in the town and the emergency shelter.
- Chief Labrie along with Officers Ryan Falvey and Benjamin O'Donnell worked at the "Picnic in the park" sponsored by the Whitin Community Center. - Dispatchers Jeffrey Mayer and Rae' Ann Leonard attended training sponsored by the FBI Boston joint Terrorism Task Force and the MA State Police. Topic-Bomb Threats and Swatting Hoaxes.
- Lt. Ouillette attended and participated in a Troop 155 Eagle Scout Review at the Congregational Church.
- Chief Labrie and Lt. Ouillette attended the monthly meeting with Advocates and the Douglas Police Department to discuss the needs of the shared Clinician funded by the MA Department of Mental Health.
