The police department received 1524 calls for service from 09/01/23 – 09/30/23. 22 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault & Battery on a Person Over 60/ Disabled, B&E Building Daytime for Felony, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Leave Scene of Personal Injury Accident and Open and Gross Lewdness. There were thirty one (31) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 1 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 6 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 39 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.
