ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1657 calls for service from 10/01/23 – 10/31/23. 25 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Aggravated Rape of Child, Assault & Battery with Dangerous Weapon (serious bodily injury), Indecent A&B on Child Under 14, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Possess to Distribute Class A and B Drugs. There were twenty five (25) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 2 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 13 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 45 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.
