ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1623 calls for service from 11/01/23 – 11/30/23. 20 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault & Battery on a Police Officer, Larceny Over, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Refusing to Identify Self and Violation of Abuse Prevention Order. There were twenty five (25) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 3 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 11 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 42 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Sgt. Mitchell trained with the CEMLEC Swat team.
- Officer Falvey participated in a group reading session at the Whitin Community Center.
- Dispatcher Christine Cooper attended a meeting sponsored with the Department of Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) as she will be taking over as the representative for the department.
- Officer Levon DerKosrofian returned to full duty status after a leg injury suffered during the arrest of a violent fugitive in August.
- Lt. Ouillette has been running the department's daily operations without Chief Labrie, who has a knee injury.
- The Emergency Medical Dispatch software was updated by PowerPhone.
