ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1619 calls for service from 12/01/23 – 12/31/23. 15 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Aggravated Rape of Child, Assault & Battery on a Police Officer, Fail to Stop for Police, Improper Storage of a Firearm, Indecent A&B on Child Under 14, Indecent Exposure, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol and Violation of Abuse Prevention Order. There were fifty one (51) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 6 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 13 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 36 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Sgt. Mitchell attended SWAT training with the CEMLEC SWAT Team.

- Lt. Ouillette and Sgt. Patrinelli processed over 75 License to Carry Firearms applications.
- Sgt. Patrinelli, Officers DeJordy, Falvey, and McDevitt (NPD Motor Unit) assisted with numerous traffic/parades to include Wreaths Across America, Town of Uxbridge Christmas Parade, Why Me Foundation in Worcester, and the Funeral for Fallen Waltham Officer Paul Tracey.
- Lt. Ouillette and Administrative Assistant to the Chief of Police Lisa Gaylord conducted interviews and background checks with prospective dispatchers to fill the two vacancies.
- Lt. Ouillette and Det. Sgt. Gorman conducted background checks on 10 prospective officers to fill a Patrolman vacancy.
