## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The police department received 1640 calls for service from 01/01/24 – 01/31/24. 26 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault & Battery on Family/ Household Member, Leave Scene of a Property Damage Accident, Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol, Possess to Distribute Class A Drug, Trafficking in More Than 10 Grams of Fentanyl and Violation of Abuse Prevention Order. There were thirty four (34) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 3 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 10 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 42 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Chief Labrie taught a Law Class for Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors at Northbridge High School.
- Chief Labrie attended a staff meeting hosted by Town Manager, Adam Gaudette.
- Chief Labrie hosted a meeting for the Northbridge Safety Committee.
- Officers of all shifts responded to over 100 calls for service during the winter rain and snowstorms.
- Under the direction of Lt. Ouillette, Det. Sgt. Gorman and Sgt. Tyler Mitchell conducted interviews for police officer candidates.
- Lt. Ouillette and Admin Ass.t to the Chief of Police, Lisa Gaylord continued to interview candidates for Dispatchers.
- Felice Covino was hired and started training as the 6th Dispatcher. Felice comes from the Foxboro Regional Dispatch Center.
- Sgt. Patrinelli processed over fifty (50) License to Carry Firearms applications.
- SRO Tom DeJordy attended a training event sponsored by the United States Attorney's Office and the FBI. Topic: Keeping Kids Safe Online-Social media, Sexting, and Gaming.
- Chief Labrie hosted a meeting of the Northbridge Safety Committee
- Chief Labrie hosted a staff meeting with the Northbridge Police Command Staff: Lt. Ouillette, Sgt.'s Patrinelli, Gorman, Collins, White, and Mitchell along with Admin Asst. to the Chief of Police, Lisa Gaylord.
- Lt. Ouillette, Det. Sgt. Gorman, and Sgt. Mitchell conducted interviews of seven (7) candidates to fill the 20th police officer position. Upon completion of the interview each candidate was ranked based on their exam score and interview score.

- Christopher Dutting was selected as the 20th officer after attaining the highest grade on both the exam and interview process. Upon appointment and successful completion of numerous exams and physical fitness tests, he will attend a police academy.
- Sgt. Patrinelli and SRO DeJordy attended a school/school bus safety training sponsored by Vendetti Motors and the TSA (Transportation Security Administration). Training was held at the Blackstone Valley Technical High School.
