ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1837 calls for service from 07/01/24 – 07/31/24. 19 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault & Battery, Home Improvement Contractor Violation, Larceny, OUI- Liquor and Vandalize Property. There were twenty nine (29) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated, 3 of the accidents resulted in personal injury. 5 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 57 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Officers of the NPD Motor Unit assisted with a funeral procession in the Town of Millbury with the CEMLEC Motor Unit.
- Chief Labrie and Lt. Ouillette attended a meeting at the Northbridge Fire Department to plan for the annual fireworks.
- The underground gas tank at the Northbridge Police Department was removed under the direction of DPW Director Jamie Luchini.
- Chief Labrie hosted the monthly meeting of the Safety Committee.
- Chief Labrie attended a meeting hosted by the Town Planner, Gary Bechtholdt.
- Lt. Ouillette and Sgt. Patrinely processed over 75 License to Carry Firearms.
- SRO Tom DeJordy assisted the Uxbridge Police Department with their Youth Police Academy
- Officers of the NPD Motor unit assisted with the “Moving Vietnam Memorial Wall”.
- SRO Tom DeJordy hosted 30 children and their families for the “Read & Feed” program sponsored by the Northbridge Police Department and Northbridge School Department.
- Under the direction of Lt. Ouillette, several officers assisted with traffic and security at the annual town fireworks.
- Several officers worked extra traffic patrols under the State of MA Traffic Safety Grant.
- Sgt. Tyler Mitchell attended CEMLEC SWAT training.
- Det. Sgt. Gorman initiated training with the new Electronic Control Weapons (Tasers). Each officer is mandated to receive six (6) hours of training prior to being issued the new Taser.
