ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1754 calls for service from 08/01/24 – 08/31/24. 14 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Abuse Prevention Order, Assault & Battery on Family/ Household Member, Breaking and Entering Nighttime, Destruction of Property, Kidnapping, OUI- Liquor, and Strangulation. There were twenty eight (28) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 7 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 46 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Several officers assisted with traffic control for the PAN MASS Challenge that travels through town each year.
- SRO DeJordy held the Northbridge Police Youth Academy for the 10th year. Over 20 youths attended the academy. Several members of the police department assisted and taught various classes throughout the week.
- Sgt. Mitchell assisted the CEMLEC Swat Team with an operation at the Xfinity Center.
- Officers of the NPD Motor Unit assisted with traffic control for the LEGO Ride, which is a charity ride for kids with cancer.
- Officers of the NPD Motor Unit assisted with the funeral of retired Uxbridge Police Sgt. Edward Pokornicki.
- Officers of the NPD Motor Unit assisted with the funeral of retired Foxborough Police Chief Ed O’Leary
- Chief Labrie met with TM Adam Gaudette, Town Counsel, and the Police Union for the purpose of contract negotiations.
- Several officers received ECW (Electronic Control Weapon-Taser) training as part of the Taser upgrade funded by the town.
- Sgt. Patrinelli processed over 50 License to Carry Firearms applications.
- Chief Labrie and Lt. Ouillette met with Jacqueline Philyaw, MA Office of Grants/Research Justice & Prevention Division to inspect the Juvenile Cell Block and Detention Policy of the Northbridge Police Department.
