**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The police department received 1614 calls for service from 09/01/24 – 09/30/24. 17 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Abuse Prevention Order, Assault & Battery on Family/ Household Member, Breaking and Entering Daytime, Destruction of Property, Intimidate Witness, OUI- Liquor 2<sup>nd</sup> offense and Trespassing. There were twenty five (25) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 5 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 42 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Officers DeJordy and Falvey worked with the Grafton Police Department on a School Bus “Stop Sign” Patrol in both the Town of Northbridge and Town of Grafton.
- All officers of the department received 4 hours of firearms training under the direction of firearms instructors Sgt. Tyler Mitchell and Officer DeJordy.
- All Dispatchers attended training sponsored by the Northbridge Fire Department. Topic: Handling “May Day” calls and various other critical responses.
- Chief Labrie attended a negotiation meeting with the police union.
- Officers worked traffic control for the annual Harvest Festival sponsored by the Village Congregational Church.
- Gorman, and Officer DerKosroffian attended training sponsored by the Wayland Police Department. Topic: Crime Tracer which is a crime reporting data base.
- Officers of the Motor Unit assisted with the Officer Ron Tarentino ride in Auburn.
- Chief Labrie, Lt. Ouillette, and Sgt. Patrinelli met with Fr. Deron DerKosroffian of the Armenia Apostolic Church to plan for the ceremony/arrival of the Armenia Pope Aram I.
- Sgt. Mitchell attended Swat/Sniper Training sponsored by the CEMLEC Swat Team.
