## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The police department received 1795 calls for service from 10/01/24 – 10/31/24. 25 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Abuse Prevention Order, Assault & Battery on Family/ Household Member, Intimidate Witness, Kidnapping, OUI-Liquor, Possess to Distribute Class D Drug and Trespassing. There were thirty six (36) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 9 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 50 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Several officers of the department completed firearms training under the direction of Sgt. Tyler Mitchell and Officer Tom DeJordy.
- Officers provided support and traffic control the funeral of Northbridge resident Lt. Colonel (Ret.) Mark Pendergast.
- Lt. Ouillette, Sgt. Brian Patrinelli, and Special Agent Chris Reinke of the FBI spoke at the Northbridge Senior Center. Topic: Fraud/Scams
- Several officers and the NPD Motor Unit provided support and traffic control for the Armenia Pope, ARAM I who was in town for a celebration of the monument at the Pine Grove Cemetery.
- Chief Labrie, Lt. Ouillette, Sgt. Patrinelli, and Officers Jordan Tredeau and Jeffrey Mayer attended the academy graduation for Officer Christopher Dutting. Officer Dutting will begin his career in law enforcement on Sunday 10/20/24 and will complete 12 weeks of Field Training under the direction of Officer Tredeau.
- Sgt. Tyler Mitchell attended SWAT/Sniper training with the CEMLEC Swat team.
- Lt. Ouillette and Sgt. Patrinelli continued to process an average of 40 License to Carry Firearms applications per week.
- Det. Sgt. Gorman completed Taser training for all officers of the department.
- Chief Labrie attended the Board of Selectman Meeting and Annual Town Meeting.
- Sgt. Patrinelli, Officer DeJordy and Admin Lisa Gaylord took part in the annual “Trunk or Treat” at the Northbridge Elementary School.
- Sgt. Tyler Mitchell completed all necessary training and passed all courses to be certified as a Sniper for the CEMLEC SWAT Team.
- Det. Sgt. Gorman attended training sponsored by the ATF.
- Chief Labrie met with Union officials for the police contract negotiations.
- Officers assigned to the NPD Motor Unit assisted with several funeral processions and events.
