The police department received 1847 calls for service from 11/01/24 – 11/30/24. 31 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault & Battery on Family/ Household Member, Distribute Class C and E Drug, False Report of Crime, OUI- Liquor, Possess Large Capacity Feeding Device Post Ban and Strangulation/ Suffocation. There were thirty six (36) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 7 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 54 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.
