ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1618 calls for service from 02/01/25 – 02/28/25. 20 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault & Battery on a Family/Household Member, Credit Card Misuse, Open and Gross Lewdness, OUI-Liquor, Trafficking in 18 grams or more (Cocaine) and Trafficking in more than 10 grams of Fentanyl. There were Twenty Five (25) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 7 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 45 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- All Officers and Dispatchers attended annual training for CPR and First Responder. The training was held at the Northbridge Fire Department and conducted under the direction of Fire Fighter Scott Celikbas,

- Several Officers attended a “Crime Scene” response/awareness seminar sponsored by Trauma 24. Trauma 24 provides crime scene clean up services.

- Sgt. Mitchell attended various SWAT Trainings and Exercises as part of his involvement in the CEMLEC SWAT Team.

- Detective Jordan Tredeau attended sexual assault investigation training.

- Sgt. Brian Collins, Sgt. Jeffrey White and Officers Leonard attended annual In-Service Training.

- Sgt. Brian Patrinelli provided Defensive Tactics training for members of the Blackstone Police Department.

- Chief Labrie attended various meetings with the Town Manager.

- Lt. Ouillette and Dispatcher Anthony Campanelli attended as “Mass Casualty” training at the Northbridge Fire Department. This training was sponsored by MEMA.
