## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The police department received 1558 calls for service from 03/01/25 – 03/31/25. 14 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault & Battery on a Family/Household Member, Distribute Material of Child in Nude, OUI-Liquor, Set Fire in Open and Strangulation. There were Thirty One (31) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 8 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 39 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Chief Labrie participated in Community Reading Day.
- Chief Labrie attended budget meetings with the Town Manager and Finance Committee.
- Lt Ouillette attended command training sponsored by the FBI.
- The newly hired dispatcher, Mark Ricard started training. Mark replaces Jared Smith, who started the police academy.
- Chief Labrie met with the Veterans Group to discuss plans for the 10-year anniversary Corporal John Dawson, KIA 4/8/2015.
- Det. Sgt. Rick Gorman and Det. Tredeau attended a two-day training course on background investigations and recruiting in the police profession.
- All officers participated in an ‘Active Shooter’ training in conjunction with the Northbridge Fire Department. Sgt. Tyler Mitchell and Officer Tom DeJordy led the training.
- Administrative Assistant Lisa Gaylord completed the annual State 911 Compliance. This involves Quality Control of 911 calls and 16 hours of Continuing Education for all dispatchers.
