#### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The police department received 1512 calls for service from 08/01/25 – 08/31/25. 29 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault with a Dangerous Weapon on person over 60, Improper Storage of a Firearm, Oui-Liquor, Possess Class B and E Drugs, Possess Firearm without a FID Card and Violate Abuse Prevention Order. There were Twenty Seven (27) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 6 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 43 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Officer Tom DeJordy ran the Northbridge Youth Police Academy with assistance from the Uxbridge PD SRO Dan Deveau. Numerous NPD officers assisted with the academy.
- Sgt. Brian Patrinelli along with our Clinician met with the homeless population in town to provide services.
- Student Officer Jared Smith graduated from the Police Academy. Officer Smith will be assigned to the 4p-12a shift during his Field Training. This will be a 12-week period and will be done under the direction of FTO Benjamin O'Donnell.
- Officers assisted with the annual "Cars in the Park" event sponsored by the Whitin Community Center.
- Officer DerKosrofian led a meeting with Spectrum to discuss the numerous outages the department has experienced over the last month.
- Unibank brought in lunch for the department as part of their community outreach program. The department and the town appreciate everything that Unibank has done for our town over the years!
- Chief Labrie hosted a Safety Committee meeting at the department. Main topic of concern was the new parking lot/traffic design pattern at Gaudette Insurance.
