ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1462 calls for service from 10/01/25 – 10/31/25. 8 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Abuse Prevention Order Violation, Assault and Battery on Family/ Household Member, Leave Scene of Property Damage Accident, Oui-Liquor, Possess to Distribute Class A Drug and Trafficking in More Than 10 Grams Fentanyl. There were Twenty Nine (29) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 5 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 26 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- · Linda Skillen passed away after a long courageous battle with Alzheimer's/Dementia. Linda worked as the Administrative Assistant to the Chief of Police and served under 3 Chiefs: Thomas J. Melia II, Thomas J. Melia III, and Walter Warchol from 1984-2014. Linda will always be remembered as a dedicated and extremely loyal member of the Northbridge Police Department. Numerous officers attended and provided support during her funeral arrangements, which was a tribute to the co-worker and friend she was to so many of us at the Northbridge Police Department.
- · Chief Labrie met with the Department of Mental Health to finalize the budget for the Co-Response program with Advocates. Advocates provides Northbridge and Douglas with a shared Clinician to help with our mental health calls.
- · SRO DeJordy did a reading day with the children at the Whitin Community Center.
- · Several officers under the direction of Lt. Ouillette took part in a bicycle/E-Bike patrol throughout town. Goal was to educate the numerous people operating E-bikes in town and remind them that they need to obey all traffic laws.
- · Officer DerKosrofian met with a representative from Verizon to plan for the installation of a backup fiber line to support current technology in the police station.
- · Chief Labrie hosted a Safety Committee meeting.
- · Sgt. Patrinelli met with BOS member Michael Wilkes and others to discuss the homeless population in town.
- · Sgt. Patrinelli conducted a recertification of the Breath test Machine used for OUI-Liquor arrests.
- · Sgt. Tyler Mitchell was notified that he received a grant in the amount of \$17,000.00 from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Program. The funds will be used to purchase new body armor for the officers. Congratulations to Sgt. Mitchell on this award, as this grant was extremely complicated and required a very thorough need-based presentation to be considered for the grant.

- · Lt. Ouillette was notified that he received a grant in the amount of \$21,000.00 from the MA Municipal Road Safety Program. Funds from this grant will be used for traffic enforcement (distracted driving, pedestrian/crosswalk enforcement, impaired driving and speeding). We will also be purchasing a new speed display sign to be used on various roads in town.
- · Sgt. Mitchell attended various SWAT training exercises.
- · Chief Labrie met with a student from the Quinsigamond Community College Police Academy to discuss a future position in the department.
- · Chief Labrie attended a town staff meeting hosted by the Town Manager.
- · Chief Labrie, Lt. Ouillette, and Admin Asst. Lisa Gaylord met with the command staff at NFD, the Town Manager, and a group from the Central Massachusetts Regional Emergency Communications Center. Topic: Regional Dispatch for Public Safety.
- · Chief Labrie attended the annual Fall Town Meeting.
- · Sgt. Patrinelli, Officer DeJordy and Admin Asst. Lisa Gaylord attended the 'Trunk or Treat" event held at the Northbridge Elementary School.
