ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1493 calls for service from 11/01/25 – 11/30/25. 20 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Abuse Prevention Order Violation, Carry Dangerous Weapon, Leave Scene of Personal Injury Accident, OUI-Liquor and Unlicensed Operation of a MV. There were Twenty Three (23) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 6 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 39 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.
