## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

The police department received 1737 calls for service from 03/01/26 – 03/31/26. 21 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: A&B on a Person with an Intellectual Disability, Child Endangerment while OUI, Fail to Stop for Police, Possess Class A Drug, Shoplifting, Unarmed Robbery and Violation of Abuse Prevention Order. There were Thirty Four (34) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 5 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 41 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.
