The police department received 1659 calls for service from 04//01/26 – 04/30/26. 16 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: A&B Domestic, Leave Scene Property Damage Accident, OUI-Liquor, Possess to Distribute Class B Drug, Trespassing and Violation of Harassment Order. There were Twenty Five (25) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 6 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 38 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.
