ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The police department received 1613 calls for service from 06//01/26 – 06/30/26. 33 Adults and Juveniles were either arrested or summoned into court for various charges to include: Assault, Embezzle/Steal Transitional Assistance Funds, Improper Storage of a Firearm, Open and Gross Lewdness, Photograph Sexual or Intimate Parts of Child, Possess a Large Capacity Firearm, Shoplifting and Violation of Abuse Prevention Order. There were Twenty Nine (29) Motor Vehicle Accidents investigated. 6 People were taken to the hospital for a Mental Health Evaluation. Officers responded to complaints that resulted in 33 Incident Reports being created for various crimes.

- Sgt. Patrinelli and Officer DeJordy met with representatives from St. Peter's Church to discuss safety and active shooter planning.
- Chief Labrie and Lt. Ouillette met with MEMA and members of the Northbridge Fire Department to plan for the 7/18/26 annual fireworks.
- Several members of the department assisted with traffic control and safety for the annual Valley Friendship Tour sponsored by OpenSky Community Service.
- Chief Labrie attended Picnic in the Park sponsored by the Whittin Community Center. Chief Labrie took part in the dunk tank as part of the event.
- Officer DerKosroffian continued to work with Verizon and outside sources to finalize the business phone lines transfer.
- SRO DeJordy met with representatives from District Attorney Joe Early's office for a donation presentation to the annual Operation Graduation Celebration for outgoing seniors.
- Officers provided traffic control and security at the annual sidewalk sale.
- Chief Labrie attended a meeting about the safety measures/security for the new Senior Center.
- Officers Alyssa Clark and Andrew Parker graduated from the Lynnfield Police Academy. Both officers will complete a 12-week Field Training Program under the direction of Sgt. Borrelli and Officer O'Donnell.

- Several officers worked on traffic enforcement shifts under the state traffic grant. Concentration was speed and distracted driving.
- Sgt. Carroll trained/certified Officers Clark and Parker with their Electronic Control Weapons (Tasers).
- Sgt. Mitchell worked with CEMLEC Swat at the FIFA World Cup games in Foxborough, MA.
- Sgt. Patrinelli attended CEMLEC Swat training.
- Sgt. Mitchell started the order for the new cruiser rifles approved at the annual town meeting.
